Item: Approval of Catalyst Seed Grant awardees

**Request:** To approve twenty-seven (27) grants for a total of \$2,696,546 in funding, for awards to twenty-seven (27) NJ based early-stage companies selected under the Catalyst Seed Grant Program. Staff is recommending to decline 43 applications because they did not obtain the average minimum score of 70 required by the program.

Staff is recommending to decline 9 applications because they did not obtain the average minimum score of 70 required by the program.
